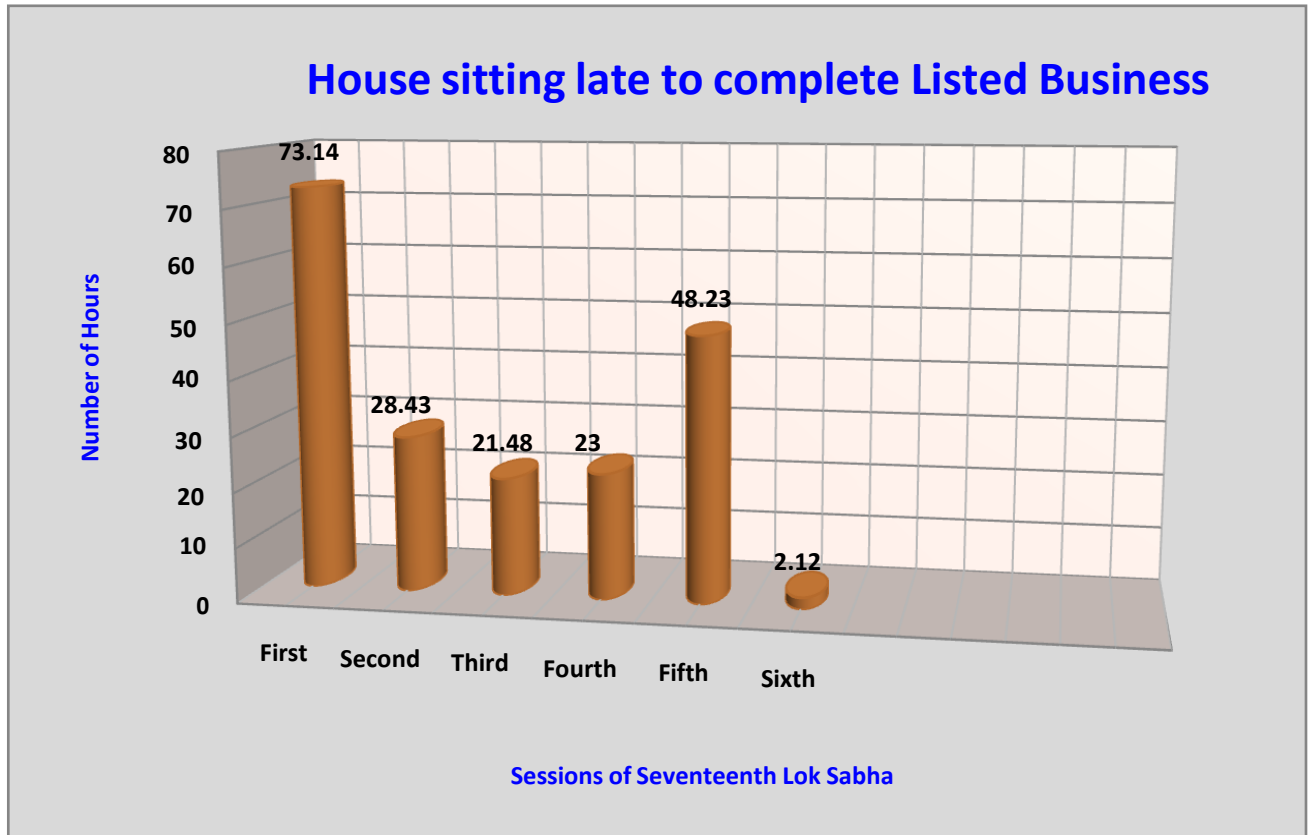


Sitting Hours and Time lost due to interruptions/forced adjournments



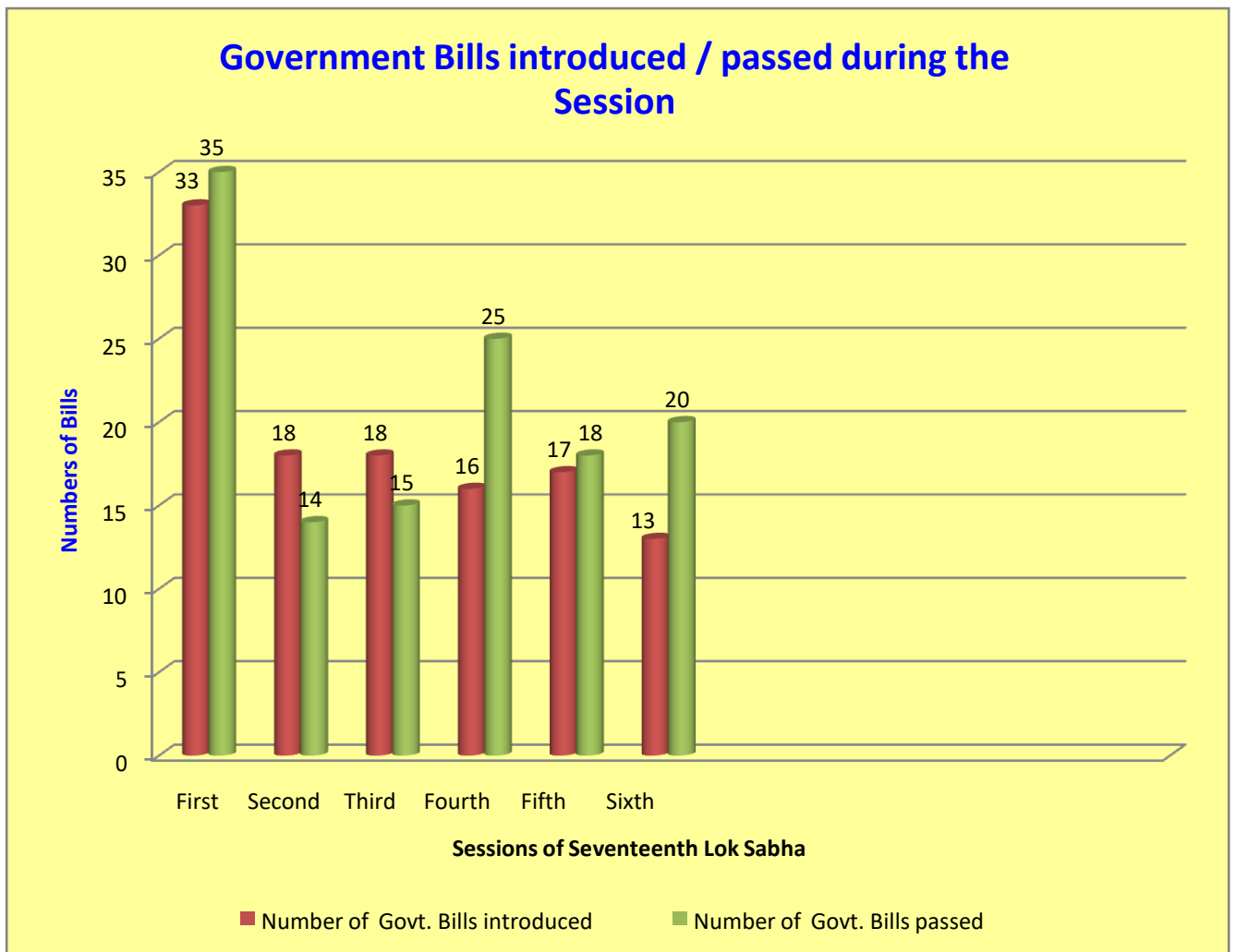

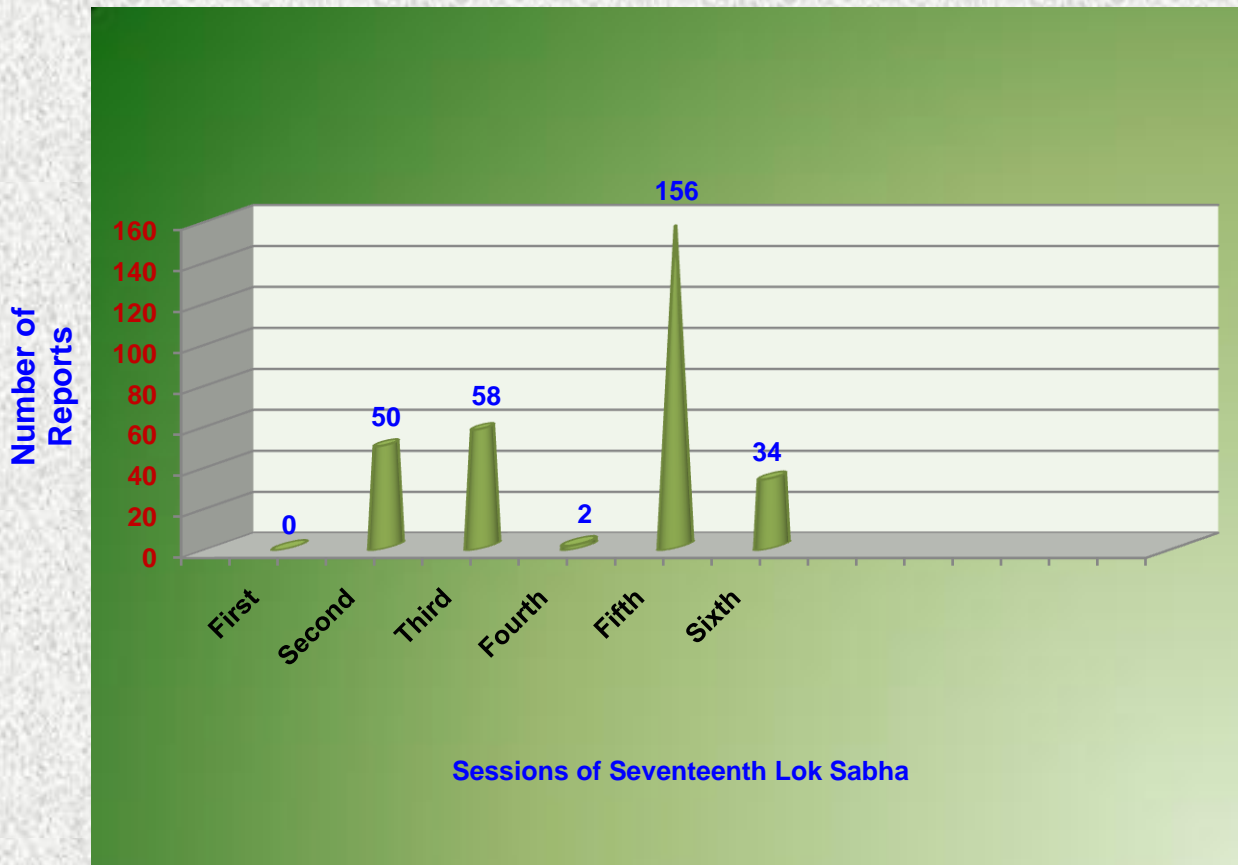

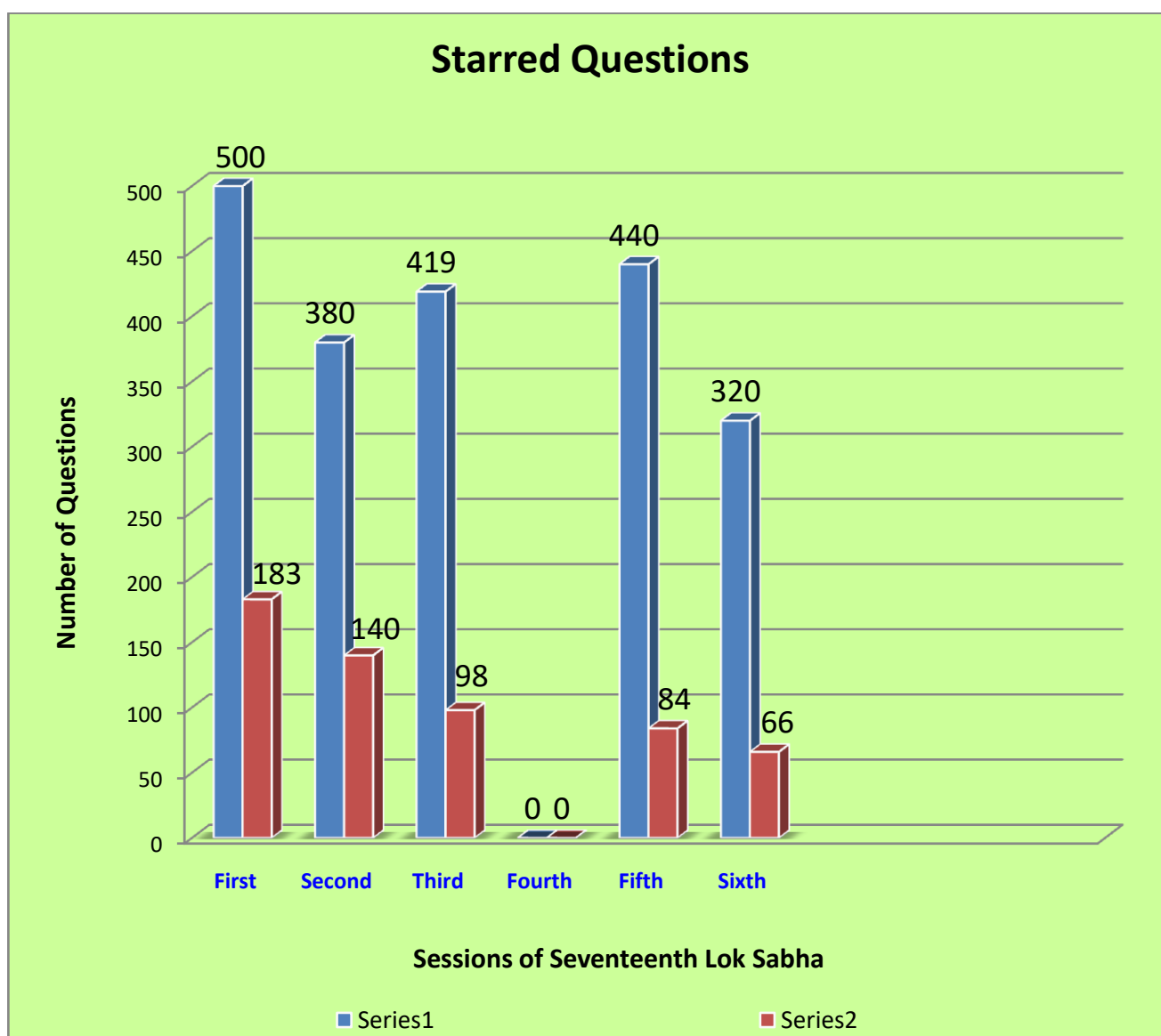
Number of Reports by Departmentally Related Standing Committees

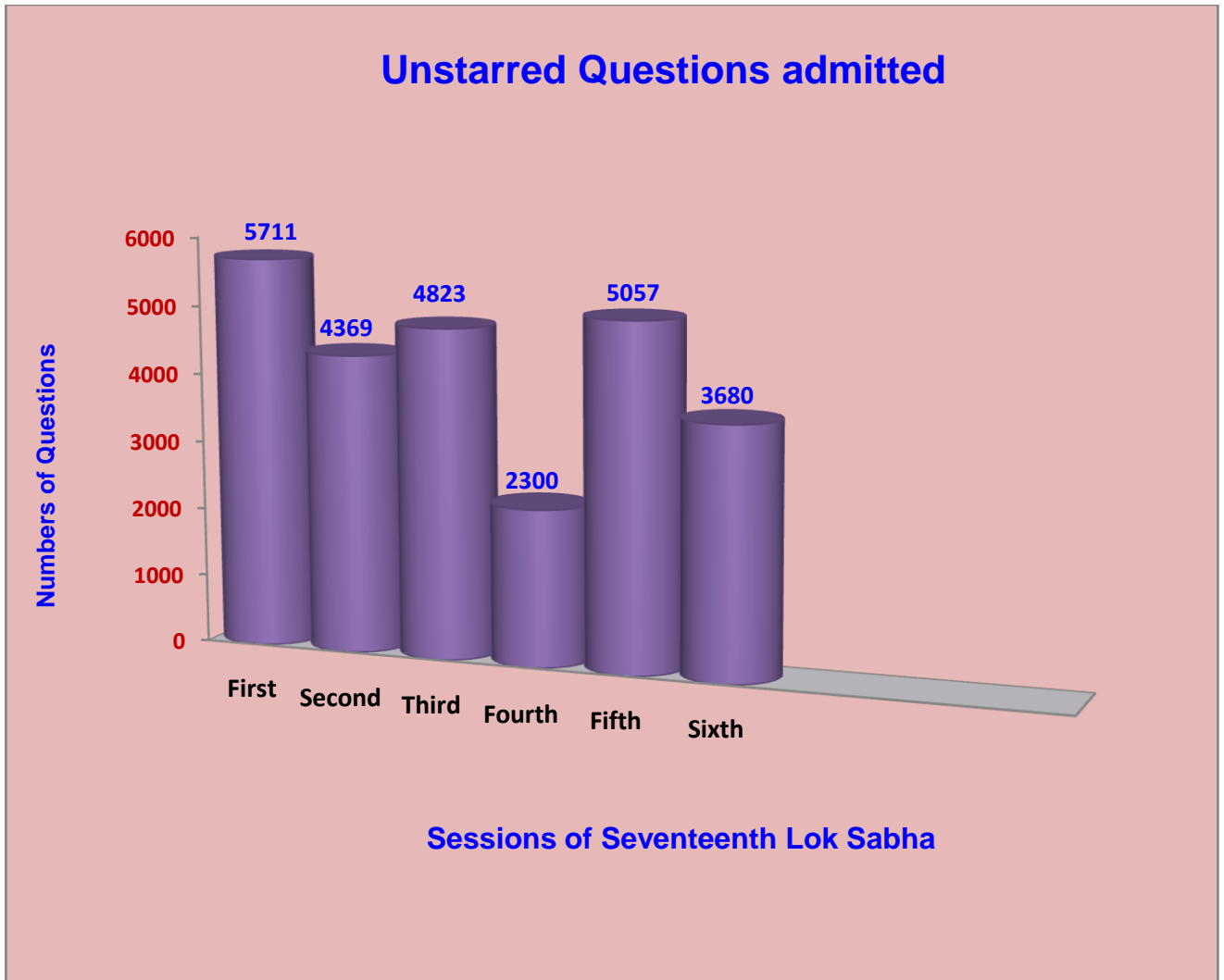
